

By the Numbers




- **1,600:** children and teens age birth to 17 signed up (and received a free book to keep!)
- **619:** children and teens finished the program
- **Over 8,052:** hours spent reading or listening to stories this summer
- **3,279:** people who attended an event for children or teens at the library
- **100%:** percentage of young readers who maintained or improved their reading skills, as reported by their parents in our parent survey
